Welcome and Introductions	Chairman's Report: Hard stop at 11:00am due to another mandatory meeting
Public Comment	None
Supplemental Old / New Business	Medication Shortages/Updates: Shortage of D50 preloads. D10 is also short, so Metro Fire may need to go to D5W. Life Assist does have a newsletter that can be pushed to us that will show shortages in meds. Wall times: *Joyce O'Connor talked about project to reduce wall times. Starting with the amount of time it takes for a paramedic to give a report. *David Buettner started a new scoring/triage process at UC Davis.

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	*Dr. Garzon used Sacramento Metropolitans Fire Departments data, with the chief's permission, on wall times for the first 3 months of the year and was scheduled to present at the Sierra Sacramento Medical Society meeting which is hosted bimonthly but the meeting was cancelled, and the data was sent to all the E.D. chiefs. *Dr. Nishjima gave a presentation on his UC Davis EMS Research on his head injury study. PowerPoint provided. Dr. Nishjima Spoke about the three (3) different clinical research projects underway and up coming: SIREN (Strategies to Innovate EmeRgENcy Care) PECARN (Pediatric Emergency Care Applied Research Network CDC Older adult head trauma Study
	New Business: Policies pulled out of turn; PD# 7500-Disaster Medical Services- Tabled-Bring back in July with edits *Dr. Garzon explains why he brought this policy back, appropriateness of triage during small scale MCl's. Dr. Garzon explains that using START/JumpSTART triage is important, but looking at our policy it implies that once an MCl is initiated trauma triage no longer applies. Dr. Garzon acknowledges the importance of using the Trauma Base Hospitals for distribution and the START/JumpSTART method for MCls but when it's a small scale MCl Trauma triage needs to still apply even for the "delayed" patients. Dr. Garzon's question is how to we communicate it to the field that Trauma Triage Criteria should still apply in MCl's? Control Facility MICN's need to also be mindful of it and when told they have 6-7 patients, trauma triage criteria should still apply. *Ric Maloney agrees that this is a good idea to have the language in PD# 7500 but to make that change PD# 7508-Simple Triage and Rapid Treatment (START)/JumpSTART needs to have language to include Trauma Triage Criteria. *David Buettner believes in an MCl situation the Control Facility gets a very brief description of the patient and they need to keep in mind to ask the questions that would determine where the patients should be transported to and communication to each other (operational level) to make sure resources are most up to date based on the evolving situation. A nurse/paramedic communication need. *Dennis Carter spoke about the issue he's noticing of potentially delaying disbursement of these patients because some
	hospitals are asking for full sets of vitals, full assessment, etc. and determining if this is trauma criteria and that being communicated is fine but delaying transport for full assessments and vital signs defeats the structure/intent of START. *David Buettner believes this communication from the field is happening. *Dr. Garzon's ask, are there any other gaps to fill? SCEMSA doesn't want to add or create unnecessary policies which are

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	why Dr. Garzon changed the purpose of 7508, but do we need to create a guideline for when the EMT/Paramedic transitions from Trauma Triage Criteria to START? Dr. Garzon states he would rather leave that to operations, up to the provider to do. Group believes that language should be added to the START/JumpSTART policy regarding critical trauma criteria (i.e. I have one minor pt. that MEETS critical trauma criteria, etc.). Dr. Garzon will go back and look at the policies and add some of the suggested edits. PD# 7508-Simple Triage and Rapid Treatment (START)/JumpSTART- Tabled, bring back in July. PD# 8060-Stroke- Dr. Garzon added language for clarification of "last seen normal" time. Dr. Garzon also spoke of if the stroke scale is 0 it is NOT a stroke alert designation, does not meet criteria.
