



COVID-19 Rapid Test Reporting Update October 18, 2022

Situational Update

COVID-19 transmission levels in Sacramento County are currently <u>low</u>. The Omicron BA.5 variant still makes up most sequenced cases but BQ.1 and BQ.1.1 are also on the rise. With the increase in influenza-like illness activity in Sacramento County, please remember to test patients with influenza-like illness for both influenza and COVID-19.

Changes to COVID-19 Rapid Test Reporting

<u>CalREDIE's Manual Laboratory Reporting (MLR)</u> Module for reporting SARS-CoV-2 point-of-care (POC) tests, including PCR and antigen tests, will be discontinued in the coming months. The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) is encouraging counties to switch to <u>SimpleReport</u>, developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Results reported by SimpleReport will be directly submitted to CalREDIE.
