## Ebola Outbreak in Uganda Declared Over January 12, 2023

### Situational Update

The Ebola outbreak (caused by the Sudan ebolavirus species) in Uganda has been declared over, with 42 days (two incubation periods) since the last case of Ebola reported. According to the [Uganda Ministry of Health](#), a total of 142 outbreak cases were reported with 56 deaths and 86 recoveries. No cases were reported outside of Uganda. Sacramento County Public Health monitored 30 returning travelers; all were low risk and did not develop symptoms.

As of January 11, CDC is no longer requiring entry screening and public health monitoring of travelers to the United States who have been in Uganda in the prior 21 days.
