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## Health Care Facility Transfer Form March 17, 2023

## **Situational Update**

According to a <u>CDC 2022 Special Report – COVID-19 U.S. Impact on Antimicrobial Resistance</u>, healthcare-associated antimicrobial-resistant infections has increased as a result of changes at healthcare settings during the pandemic (i.e. antimicrobial use, infection control). Healthcare-associated antimicrobial-resistant infections increased at least 15% from 2019 to 2020.

In order to reduce the spread of healthcare acquired infections, a health order has been issued as of January 23, 2023 that requires the transferring healthcare facility (HCF) to complete Sacramento County Public Health's (SCPH) Health Care Facility Transfer Form to provide to the receiving HCF for all transfers among HCFs within Sacramento County. After discussion with our healthcare partners, the form has been revised to incorporate feedback from our partners. The form is attached.
