Public Health Officer's Report	<p>Update by Dr. Law</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• We are currently seeing low levels of COVID-19, flu and RSV• The federal state of emergency will end on May 11th and CDPH will no longer update certain portions of the COVID-19 dashboard.• The bivalent COVID-19 vaccine can now be used as the primary vaccine used and monovalent vaccines will no longer be used. CDC has an updated immunization schedule available on the website. Booster recommendations depend on pre existing health conditions and should consult with primary care and CDC website.• There is currently a resurgence of MPOX in Chicago, IL for providers to be aware of. We are seeing mild to severe cases among vaccinated individuals. With upcoming PRIDE events happening in June it is important for at risk individuals to get vaccinated. Unvaccinated people have a 14X higher risk for MPOX.• The California Conference of Local Health Officers had a large focus on CalAIM this spring.

<p>MCAH Update</p>	<p>Presented by Leesa Hooks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Happy National Nurses Week • Happy Asian American Pacific Islander Heritage Month • We will be seeing some local changes to the BIH program and will report on that at the next MCAH AB meeting. • CalAIM does target birth inequities. We will be looking at determining which MCAH program might be eligible to become Enhanced Care Management providers since both NFP and BIH serve high risk birthing populations. We will be taking a deeper look at this. • CDPH has social media posts available around the a One Pill Can Kill Public Awareness Campaign to educate the public of the dangers of counterfeit pills with fentanyl. This would be a good resource for Adolescent Health Month in May. • CPSP and CHDP are still scheduled to sunset at present. Some of the CPSP duties like TA and enrollment will transfer to the managed care plans. • Student-run clinics affiliated with UC Davis may be able to help fill the CHDP gaps. They can provide a mobile pediatric clinic. • Shout out to Dr. Wang who does so much good work in his free time! What an asset to our board.

<p>NFP Update</p>	<p>Presented by Fay Bursch</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Currently have 8 nurses with 1 nurse out on parental leave due back in June • There are currently 200 clients for 8 nurses and we will be adding 3 more positions to the State General funding so that will mean we can serve an additional 55 new clients. • We will be recruiting nurses that represent the communities served, and we have multiple language needs since the influx of refugees in the community. We have a specific need for Spanish and Farsi. • We have been able to connect with a Kaiser Medi-Cal Specialist. BIH, Community Nursing and NFP presented to 50 nurses and social workers. • Multiple health fairs will be happening in June. DHA will have a Health Fair and we will attend the WIC open house in Natomas to share resources. • Signed MOU with Sacramento diaper bank so each client will get 100 free diapers a month, the clients are grateful for this service and it has helped to increase in person visits. • Staff going through FAN (Facilitating Attuned Interactions) training which is a conceptual model and practical tool for building relationships and reflective practice. Hoping to help clients feel heard to open space for change. • We had a site visit from our Nurse Consultant to set goals for the next year. • We have a 6.4% premature birth rate which is lower than last year and a 96% breastfeeding at birth rate which is up from last year. • The graduation rate is 58% which is higher than the rest of the State.
<p>Policy Update</p>	<p>Presented by Katie Andrew</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AB19 -Public Schools will have 2 doses of Narcan on campuses • AB249- Require water systems to test for lead • AB608- CPSP align post pregnancy eligibility period with Medi-Cal • AB665- Make it easier for minor consent to mental health protected services • AB1202 – Time and distance standards for children’s health • SB608- Child health & safety license plate fund increased fees for local childcare and planning development councils • AB1015- Administer a diaper program for low income families
